Decision taken

The Police and Crime Commissioner has taken a decision to accept the recommendation of the formal transfer of the assets of Chief Constable to the Police and Crime Commissioner with an effective accounting date of 1st April 2016.

Details of advice taken

The PRSRA 2011 required that an agreed strategy for the allocation for the responsibility for the assets of Northamptonshire Police be effected.

This required that the assets be either assigned to the PCC or the CC or both.

This was done as part of stage 2 of the PRSRA 2011 effective from the 1st April 2014.

The original decision was to allocate the assets to both the Chief Constable and the Police and Crime Commissioner.

This decision to allocate the assets between the PCC and CC has caused accounting complexity for the closedown of the 2014-15 and 2015-16 accounts.

To ease the accounting for the 16-17 closedown it was recommended that the assets of the Chief Constable be transferred to the Police and Crime Commissioner.

Advice on this has matter has been taken with both CIPFA (The Chartered Institute for Public Finance) as well as the Home Office.

The PRSRA 2011 is no longer applicable for the purpose of this decision.

There are no cost implications.
