## 1. Purpose of Report

1.1 To outline funding for ChISVA

## 2. Decision(s) Recommended:

2.1 To recommend the funding of a FTC ChISVA from 16<sup>th</sup> Aug 2017 until 31<sup>st</sup> March 2018

## 3. Relevant background / Chronology of Key Events:

- 3.1 NHSE provided additional one off funding for a FTC ChISVA within Serenity SARC between August 2016 and August 15<sup>th</sup> 2017. However this funding has now ceased and additional resource for ChISVA is still required for the county.
- 3.2 The OPCC will be taking responsibility for all ISVA and ChISVA provision from 1<sup>st</sup> April 2018. A new sustainable approach will be designed to ensure services can be delivered with sustainable funding in place.
- 3.3 A gap in funding was identified for the FTC ChISVA between 16<sup>th</sup> august 2017 and 31<sup>st</sup> March 2018.

3.4 It was recommended that the OPCC provide the additional bridge funding of £20,000 from the Commissioning fund as a one-off to enable service continuation based on current caseloads.

#### 4. Consultation:

4.1 Serenity and Service Six who currently employ the FTC ChISVA were consulted on options for continuation of funding.
