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About Us....

The Early Intervention and Youth Service is funded and delivered by the Office of the Police, Fire and Crime Commissioner. It is a consent-based service to assist professionals to support children, young people and their family's offering advice and guidance, signposting to services & direct support work in the home, at school/nursery or in the community.

The team look to intervene at the earliest point of identification and work with families, children, and young people whose needs are identified using the county wide threshold identification as being **TIER 2.**

TIER 2 is defined as: "These children/families may require extra support in order to promote their safety and happiness and to explore the support of family and services to maintain safety in the community. The nature of need may be short term or more moderate in nature."

The Early Intervention and Youth Service looks to prevent damage caused by Adverse Childhood Experiences (**ACE's.**) These are traumatic events which occur during childhood that can have negative and lasting effects on a person's health and behaviour.



Our goal is to prevent the impact of adverse childhood experiences, supporting young people and families to reduce the chances of future generations entering criminal behaviour, unhealthy relationships, violence, substance misuse, ill health and exploitation. The Early Intervention Service is made up of **4** strands of work working across multi agency pathways & offer a range of services:

Targeted Youth Team

- Targeted youth work on a range of topics as a 1:1 intervention over 12 weeks.
- $\circ\quad$ Group work within schools.

Domestic Abuse Support Team

- Advice & guidance for domestic violence victims in relation to next steps, non-molestation orders, harassment warnings & signposting to legal services.
- 1:1 support at home or in the community.
- DASH assessment with victims & safety planning.

Locality Support Team

- 1:1 holistic family support delivered directly in the home.
- Advocacy and support at meetings with other professionals.

Youth Violence Intervention Unit (YVIU)

 Support for young people to reduce the risks of criminal exploitation & knife crime.

Missing Persons Investigation Unit

 Identifying needs of support early in children who have gone missing to reduce further missing episodes & reduce demand on Police.



*Thresholds do not apply to our Domestic Abuse service or the MPIU and YVIU cohort.

The work being delivered by my Early Intervention and Youth Service is key in helping to deliver that ambition, and I am very proud of everything it has already achieved over the last 12 months.

It has supported families affected by domestic abuse; worked with young people who go missing to understand their issues and prevent further episodes; and provided targeted youth work to divert young people away from exploitation.

Solving complex social problems and keeping the public safe requires a multi-agency approach. I am working to develop a countywide youth strategy which will have input from partners and young people themselves.

The work being delivered by the Early Intervention and Youth Service will play a vital part in the delivery of that strategy.

Prevention is at the heart of building safer communities. I have no doubt the continued delivery from the service, along with further work alongside our partners, will help us to achieve the long-term change that is required.

In this reporting year, the hard work and commitment demonstrated by my team to support families, children and young people has been tremendous. The Service has seen an increase in demand across the whole county and the team have shown flexibility and problem solving to ensure there is a balance between managing demand and delivering high quality support.

This year has seen the team diversify into some new projects working alongside the Force, supporting children and young people who have gone missing. This has been a hugely successful initiative and has been nominated for a national Prevention Work Award. This initiative has received interest from other Forces as a model of good practice.

The team continue to support victims and their children who have been impacted by Domestic Abuse and family conflict. Nine of the ten practitioners qualified as an Independent Domestic Abuse Advisor (IDVA) with our newest team member qualifying next year.

Youth workers have continued to work with schools and Academies offering educational input to groups of young people and individuals, exploring and understanding issues around exploitation, online harm and knife crime. This continued partnership approach helps to make the identification, engagement, and good outcomes possible.

The team have continued to support the Youth Violence Intervention Unit, preventing those young people identified as vulnerable to exploitation and harm from requiring Police intervention.

This year puts the Service in a really good position to move towards the delivery of the Commissioners new Safe and Sound plan giving opportunity to offer targeted support for young people who are at risk of entering the criminal justice system. "

Our Commitment to Safeguarding

Our commitment to safeguarding children and young people:

Northamptonshire Office of Police, Fire and Crime Commissioner (OPFCC) Early Intervention and Youth Services recognises our responsibility to safeguard and promote the welfare of all children who are referred to our service. We will endeavour to ensure that those children who access our services are respected and valued. We will be alert to the signs of abuse and neglect and follow our procedures to ensure that children receive effective support and that their fears and concerns will be taken seriously and that their voices are heard.

Safeguarding is everyone's responsibility. We recognise that our service is part of a wider safeguarding system and will work closely with the Northamptonshire Safeguarding Children Partnership and other agencies to promote the welfare of children.



2024 Highlights

- The Early Intervention Service have had a 46% Increase in the total referrals we received into the service year on year.
- Our acceptance rate was 64% with a 36% increase in the number of referrals we accepted from 2023.
- Overall Northamptonshire Police account for 79.9% of all the total referrals accepted across the service. Geographically, Northampton remains the busiest area across all our projects.

Locality Project: 'Parenting' and 'Behavioural Issues' are still biggest presenting factors for the Locality project who work with families within the home. We have also seen a big jump in the number of referrals coming through to us from the education sector as a result of our 'Adverse Childhood Experiences' training in the county and for school avoidance issues. We have been working closely with young people to gain their voices, work with schools and working with our partners to safeguard the children and families we support.

Youth Project: The Youth projects biggest growth has been seen in the Northampton area with 'Behavioural Issues' and 'Young Peoples mental health and wellbeing' still the main presenting factors.

Domestic Abuse Project: 90% of our DA team are now IDVA qualified. 'Physical Abuse' and 'Harassment' remain the biggest contributing factors for DA overall with issues around 'Child Contact' increasing by 5.2%. The Adult Domestic Abuse project have seen cases involving harassment grow 13.2% from last year. Overall, the Domestic Abuse project saw a 51% increase in the number of referrals accepted from 2023.


YVIU: The Youth Violence Intervention Unit have seen the biggest growth in the number of referrals taken in 2024 to be in Corby and East Northants. Just under 50% of young people we worked with were in mainstream education with the main presenting factors of 'Anti-Social Behaviour' growing to 36.2% and 'Knife Crime' accounting for 32.1%.

MPIU: Now having completed its first year, the Missing Person Investigation Unit project was allocated the operational name: 'Op Satin'. 'Op Satin' was included in a National Review that was submitted to Ministers in March 2024 and we attended the National Missing Persons Conference and presented to delegates the aims, objectives, and success of 'Op Satin'. We supported Northumbria Police Missing Persons Team with advice and guidance to create their own Early Intervention Project for young people reported missing.


The main presenting factors affecting young people seen was 'Parenting / Family Relationships' & 'Friendships & Relationship' issues which accounted for over 50% of cases.




Referral Acceptance By Specialism



Who referred to us?


Who Referred to the OPFCC Early Intervention & Youth Service?



OPFCC Early Intervention workers support the Missing Persons Investigation Unit (MPIU) with visiting young people who to date, have **3** or less missing episodes.

"I was able to actually speak to someone who understands me. My mental health has gotten better. I haven't been reported missing again since."



Within the first year (November 2023 – November 2024) 88% of young people referred to us have not since been reported missing.

Who have we supported?

Our Youth team helped <u>238</u> individual young people between the ages of 11 – 18 for up to 12 weeks with tailored 1:1 support. Our Missing Person Investigation Unit (MPIU) support workers visited 514 vulnerable young people from August 2023 to identify needs of support to prevent further missing episodes.

Our Locality Practitioners

supported <u>461</u> individual families for up to 12 weeks with 1:1 support.


Our Domestic Abuse Practitioners accepted <u>2651</u> domestic abuse referrals, contacting each family or individual victim to offer support. The Youth Violence Intervention Unit (YVIU) reached out to <u>324</u> young people who had been identified as being involved in serious violent crime and exploitation.

As a service, that's over **5,359** children we have reached.



Outcomes - Domestic Abuse Project




Outcomes - Youth Project






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Outcomes - Locality Project






Demand By Geographical Area



Where have the DA Project been working?




Where have the Locality Project been working?






Where have Youth Violence Intervention Unit been working?







Parenting Workshops

Our online parenting workshops are open to any family or individual meeting any threshold level, they do not have to be currently working with us to be eligible to participate.

Professionals can refer individuals onto a selection of the 1-hour, virtual workshops through a dedicated referral form, each one presented by two of our highly skilled Practitioners. "Really helpful, lots of content that was relevant and made us think! Enabled us to have a good conversation with our teen afterwards to talk about boundaries and challenges. We also had a good conversation about the positives in our family and helped to see things with a bit more perspective rather than thinking it was all negative behaviour. Thank You!"



Our Youth workers and Practitioners have been delivering targeted groupwork programmes throughout Northamptonshire schools and working with partners attending multi agency days and beginning to deliver 'Understanding the Risks of Child Exploitation' webinars to children directly – all aimed at helping young people keep themselves safe from harm and exploitation.

In total we have reached 2677 Young People





We have begun working closely with care homes and education settings to educate staff and carers on recognising the signs

We have introduced a new parenting workshop into our range of online support – 'The Internet, Social Media and Young People'

Days of action with Northants police for the Youth Violence Intervention Unit with British Transport Police focusing on county lines We are delivering webinars to help educate school students on understanding 'child exploitation'. These are then followed up with drop-in sessions Training all new recruits into Northamptonshire police force on the work we do tackling knife crime and supporting victims of domestic violence
